




Boys & Girls Club of Norman Celebrates Hispanic Heritage Month

To help celebrate the rich heritage and traditions of Hispanic culture, Boys & Girls Club of Norman dedicated an entire week focusing on Hispanic Heritage Month. Our amazing group of teen members helped lead the charge by planning and executing a Hispanic heritage showcase, complete with food, games and art. The teens collectively decided to celebrate the two countries that are demographically most represented in the Club: Mexico and Venezuela.



For the art showcase, the teens led a Lucha Libre Mexican wrestling sand painting activity, which allowed everyone to flex their creativity! To help get everyone moving, the teens taught younger members soccer dribbling techniques in preparation for pin bowl soccer matches. To round out the showcase, nachos were prepared and served, honoring Mexico, and Papitas de Leche were served in honor of Venezuela culture. In addition to the showcase, members also played various educational games focusing on a variety of Hispanic heritage.



Our teen group put their heart and soul into this celebration, dedicating a full week to planning and preparation! They all did a remarkable job working as a group and helping mentor their younger counterparts.
